SECTION A - General

Introduction

The Tuggeranong Netball Association Incorporated herein known as TNA Inc. is governed by the TNA Rules (also known as Constitution) in relation to the running of the Association, and these By-Laws in relation to the running of the netball competition. These By-Laws are to be read in conjunction with the Rules. The Interpretations detailed in Rule 1 of the Rules apply to these By-Laws.

1 Colours

- 1.1 The TNA Inc colours shall be valley green, navy blue and white.

SECTION B - Administration

2 Methods for Achieving Objectives

The TNA Inc. objectives are detailed in Rule 2 of the TNA Inc. Rules, the methods for achieving these objectives are:

- 2.1 Communicating with netball clubs, establishing a network of contacts in these organisations, and promoting netball through the media, community groups etc.
- 2.2 Stressing the benefits of netball at both the competitive and social level by organising competitions for all age groups at all levels of ability.
- 2.3 Arranging skills development opportunities for all netballers to be conducted by both internal coaches and external specialists.
- 2.4 Providing opportunities for older players, parents and others, who show interest and potential as skills trainers, to attend appropriate training and skills development courses.
- 2.5 Setting standards for representative players, informing all coaches of the standards, and encouraging and helping them to attain these standards.
- 2.6 Implementing National umpiring badging schemes and encouraging participation at all levels in internal and external umpiring clinics.

3 Codes of Behaviour

- 3.1 There will be no smoking in the pavilion, grounds or the surrounds of TNA Inc.
- 3.2 No alcohol will be allowed in the pavilion, grounds or the surrounds of TNA Inc. except on occasions where special permission is sought and granted by the Executive.
- 3.3 The TNA Code of Conduct outlines the behavioural standards for all persons involved in TNA.

4 Executive and Officials

- 4.1 Part 3 of the TNA Inc Rules details the list of Executive positions required for the TNA committee.
- 4.2 The TVRUC Delegate will be the President and the reserve will be the Vice President Admin. The Executive is to have the power to re-appoint these positions from within the committee if there are reasons why the delegated persons cannot perform the duties.

5 Responsibilities of Executive Members and Officials

- 5.1 In accordance with the Rules and By-Laws of TNA Inc, the Executive Committee will ensure that each of the objectives in Rule 2 of the TNA Inc Rules is reached in a professional and effective manner. In order to do this the Executive will meet, if required, once a month. Sub-committees of the Executive will meet as required by the Chair of the sub-committee or the Executive.
- 5.2 Communication between the Executive Committee members must be organised and effective. Each Executive Committee member has an obligation to attend meetings. Each Executive Committee member will take part in decision-making processes on an equal basis except where a casting vote is prescribed in the TNA Rules.
- 5.3 Executive Committee decisions must be communicated to all members of TNA Inc.
- 5.4 The Executive Committee will review and revise, if necessary, the objectives and the methods for achieving the objectives of the Association at the end of each Committee year and will report their findings to the Annual General Meeting.
- 5.5 The Executive Committee shall distribute duty statements for each Executive and official position in accordance with the Rules of TNA Inc.

6 Committees and Sub-committees

- 6.1 Committees and Sub-committees may be formed at any time at the request of the Executive Committee. Such Committees shall include the President and the Secretary as ex-officio members.
- 6.2 Executive has the power to co-opt persons to assist with the business of any particular committee.
- 6.3 Members of the Executive are eligible to stand for election to committees or sub-committees.
- 6.4 Responsibilities of the Appeals Tribunal are to include:
 - a. Notify teams concerned with the case of the specified time;
 - b. Clubs involved in tribunal hearing to be notified of decision within 24 hours;
 - c. A letter stating the complaint is to be handed to the Tribunal Chairperson by the Secretary. Tribunal Chairperson is to refrain from showing letter to all persons concerned with the hearing of appeals (including Tribunal Members) until commencement of hearing.
- 6.5 The following matters will be managed by the Tribunal:
 - a. Unauthorised persons changing the umpire of a match;
 - b. Undue and unkind criticism from the sideline;
 - c. Complaints from players re:
 - (1) disputes about results, scoresheets etc;
 - (2) appeals re loss of points;
 - (3) standard of umpiring of a match;
 - (4) behaviour of an umpire;
 - d. Breaches of competition rules.

SECTION C - Competition Rules

7 Rules of Play

- 7.1 The Association shall adopt the rules of play of the Official Rule Book of Netball Australia, the World Netball Rulebook 2024. Exceptions are:
 - a. Length of quarters, intervals for quarter, half and three-quarter time, will be at the discretion of the responsible Convenor, within the following guidelines:

- (1) Length of quarters - between 10 and 15 minutes;
- (2) Length of interval at quarter and three-quarter time: 1-3 minutes;
- (3) Length of interval at half time: 3-5 minutes

Note: The length of the quarters will be consistent throughout the whole game, and teams should be notified before play commences, for exception see 8.3.

b. Substitution rules set out in the World Netball Rulebook 2024. Blood Rule:

- (1) For a fully timed game the blood policy as set out in the Official Rule Book of Netball Australia, World Netball Rulebook 2024, amendments applied in 2020 by Netball Australia will apply.
- (2) For centrally timed games the blood policy as set out in the World Netball Rulebook 2024 will apply, except that the affected player may be replaced for the duration the player is being tended to; the Umpire is not required to hold time. The affected player may retake the court in accordance with the rules of Netball Australia. If the affected player is unable to return to the court this will count as a substitution for the team.

8 Competition Format and Player Eligibility

8.1 The TNA Competition shall be divided into the following competition categories:

- a. **Senior** This category is open to all players aged fifteen and above (the player must be turning 15 in the calendar year of the competition). Special permission must be given by the Executive for younger players to participate in this category along with parental consent.
 - (1) The Senior Group will be comprised of Divisions.
 - (2) Each Division will be a separate competition.
 - (3) Teams will be allocated within a Division according to skills and capabilities as per the TNA grading policy.
- b. **Cadets** All players attending high school in the years 10 to 12 are eligible to play in this Group. Players in years 8 and 9 who have the appropriate skills are eligible to play up in this category. Special permission must be given by the Executive for younger players to participate in this category along with parental consent.
 - (1) The Cadets category will be comprised of Divisions.
 - (2) Each Division will be a separate competition.
 - (3) Teams will be allocated within a Division according to skills and capabilities as per the TNA grading policy.
 - (4) Players in years 10 to 12 must play in the Cadet category as their first game. This does not preclude the same player from

playing in the Senior category should they meet the standard guidelines.

- (5) Teams may be made up of players from different ages or years at school.

c. **Intermediate** All players attending high school in the years 7 to 9 are eligible to play in this Category. Players in year 6 who have the appropriate skills are eligible to play up in this category. Special permission must be given by the Executive for younger players to participate in this category along with parental consent.

- (1) The Intermediates category will be comprised of Divisions.
- (2) Each Division will be a separate competition.
- (3) Teams will be allocated within a Division according to skills and capabilities as per the TNA grading policy.
- (4) Players in years 7 to 9 must play in the Intermediate category as their first game. This does not preclude the same player from playing up in the Cadet category or Seniors category should they meet the standard guidelines.
- (5) Teams may be made up of players from different ages or years at school.

d. **Junior** All players attending primary school in years 4, 5 and 6 are eligible to play in this Category.

- (1) The Juniors Category will be comprised of Grades.
- (2) Each Grade will be a separate competition.
- (3) Teams will be allocated within a Grade.
- (4) Teams may be made up of players from lower ages or years at school if they have the appropriate skills.
- (5) The winners of each Grade competition shall be decided based upon the team with the highest placement at the completion of the regular season.
- (6) Only players in the Grade 6 competition/s are permitted to play a second game up in the Intermediates category. There is no restriction on the Intermediates Division that the Grade 6 player plays in, as they should be placed in competitions relating to their ability not just age according to these By-Laws.

e. **Netta** All players attending primary school in years 2 and 3 are eligible to play in this Group.

- (7) The Netta Group will be comprised of Grades.
- (8) Teams will be allocated within a Grade.
- (9) The rules played will be the "Netta" rules as approved by All Australia Netball Association.

- (10) Players in this Group are permitted to play a second game up in the Junior Group, Year 4 Grade only, if they have the appropriate skill level.

8.2 Where ages are specified, it is the age of the player at December 31st of the year the competition commences.

8.3 A player is considered to be a Registered player in a TNA Competition if:

- a. The player has completed their registration via the approved Netball Australia and/or TNA registration mechanism and;
- b. Has paid their registration fee as part of the registration, including payment using an approved waiver of fees method and;
- c. Has been allocated to a team nominated within that TNA Competition.

8.4 A player is considered to be a Fill-in player in a TNA Competition if:

- a. The player has not completed registration as per By-Law 8.3 or;
- b. The player has completed registration as per By-Law 8.3 and are not competing in the team/s that they were allocated to as per By-Law 8.3(c).

8.5 Any Registered player in the Junior, Intermediate, Cadet and Senior category may play three games as a Fill-in player (as per By-law 8.4(b)) for an individual team in any higher Division or Grade. If the player plays a fourth game with that individual team in the higher Division or Grade, then the player must remain with that team for the remainder of the season and is ineligible to return to their original team.

8.6 No member of the Association shall be permitted to play in another club within the Association during a competition without first receiving permission from the original club with which the player is registered as per By-Law 8.3. This player is considered to be a Fill-in player under By-Law 8.4(b).

8.7 In any one Division or Grade, players may only play in the team/s in which they are registered as per By-Law 8.3, except as provided in By-Laws 8.5 and 8.6.

8.8 Players who are playing in more than one category must be registered in each category and allocated to a team.

9 Competition

9.1 Competition matches between teams shall be controlled by the Vice President Competition and shall be played in accordance with such regulations, as the TNA Inc Committee shall approve. Grading matches shall be held on dates to be determined by the Vice President Competition. Teams may be regraded by the Grading committee in accordance with the TNA grading policy.

9.2 Teams who forfeit two games in any one competition or do not fulfil their umpiring duties on two occasions during the season, will lose any competition points accrued to that date for that season.

10 Clubs

- 10.1 The definition of a “club” as applied to these rules is detailed in TNA Inc Rule 1.1 b.
- 10.2 Clubs will be governed by the Rules and By-Laws as set out in the documents promulgated by the Tuggeranong Netball Association Incorporated
 - a. The Tuggeranong Netball Association Incorporated Rules, and
 - b. The Tuggeranong Netball Association Incorporated By-Laws.
 - c. Clubs are governed under The Associations Act. TNA have a minimum standard for all clubs above 3 or more teams. For single teams or two (2) teams these are recommended as guidelines, and clubs should work to adopt a good governance model. This includes setting up your committee, rules, frequency of meetings and position roles.
 - d. Establish best practice with regards to corporate governance including management of money. All clubs must have a separate bank account with the majority of funds retained in that account, with a minimum of two approved committee members to sign.
 - e. Ensure all committee members, coaches, team managers and officials hold a valid Working with Vulnerable People Card and supply assurance that these are held is provided to the TNA office.
 - f. Provide TNA with a copy of your AGM minutes and financials as requested.

11 Team Registration

- 11.1 Team registrations to a TNA Competition shall close on a date to be fixed by the Executive each year.
- 11.2 A team is considered to be registered to a TNA Competition if:
 - a. The team has been allocated to a TNA Competition Division or Grade by the Club via the approved Netball Australia and/or TNA registration mechanism and;
 - b. The team contains a minimum of seven (7) Registered players (as per By-Law 8.3), nominated to that team.
- 11.3 In the event of a query regarding age, a birth certificate must be produced.
- 11.4 New players may be nominated to a team at any time during the season, providing they are Registered players as per By-Law 8.3 and registration is completed prior to participation in a competition match.
- 11.5 A Fill-in player as per By-Law 8.4(a) only may play three games in a TNA Competition in the same year, in any team and any Division or Grade, without registering.

- 11.6 The Fill-in player must be recorded on the competition game scoresheet in the Fill-in player section.
- 11.7 A Fill-in player is ineligible to play a fourth game in the same year in the same TNA competition in any Division or Grade. Prior to competing in any further competition games, they must register as per By-Law 8.3 and be allocated to a team in the TNA Competition as per By-Law 11.4.
- 11.8 All player registrations are subject to approval by the Executive.
- 11.9 Grading and re-grading of all teams after registration in a TNA Competition will be in accordance with the TNA grading policy.

12 Fees

- 12.1 Registration fees for TNA competitions shall be as determined by the Executive. No player shall take the court until such time as the fees are paid in full, by the date set by the Executive.
- 12.2 All fees for TNA Representative Teams are to be paid at the beginning of competition, juniors by the first carnival. Players cannot take the court until fees are paid in full.
- 12.3 Players selected for Representative teams with outstanding fees will not be included in teams for the following season until all outstanding fees are finalised.
- 12.4 TNA Inc reserves the right to enter into a "Fees Payment Agreement" with individuals as it determines necessary. Individuals may approach the TNA Executive through the VP Rep to seek such dispensation.
- 12.5 TNA Inc reserves the right to enter into a "Fees Payment Agreement" with individuals, teams and clubs as it determines necessary. Individual teams and clubs may approach the TNA Executive to seek such dispensation.

13 Uniform

- 13.1 Each club shall be allowed to wear a uniform of their own colour and design providing it has been registered and approved by the TNA Inc Executive upon affiliation.
- 13.2 No player shall be allowed to compete in any Association fixture unless wearing the registered uniform of the club. Skirts and bodysuits (except as in 13.7) must be worn. Sports briefs shall not be transparent.
- 13.3 The umpire shall have the power to veto any article of attire they may consider dangerous.
- 13.4 Footwear is to be rubber-soled sports shoes, not necessarily of uniform colour.
- 13.5 When a team takes the court, they must be all in the same colours, i.e. all tops must be the same colour.

- 13.6 Track pants may be worn, provided a skirt is also worn, and provided the track pants are the registered colour of the club or team (not necessarily the same colour as the skirt or bodysuit).
- 13.7 Bike shorts may be worn provided a skirt or bodysuit is also worn and provided the bike shorts are the registered colour of the club (not necessarily the same colour as the skirt or bodysuit).
- 13.8 All players must wear position patches back and front while on the court.
- 13.9 Gloves may be worn by players at all levels of competition within the control of TNA Inc. Gloves must be in good condition and fingernails must still be short and smooth, as per the official rules of the game.
- 13.10 Protective tops may be worn under bodysuits provided the tops are the registered colour of the team or club (not necessarily the same colour of the bodysuit).
- 13.11 Earrings and studs must be removed for any TNA sponsored competition as per the official rules of the game. Taping of earrings and studs is not permitted under any circumstances.
- 13.12 NOTE: Netball Australia policy states that if jewellery is not able to be removed for religious / medical reasons, it is the player's choice to play with them, and this player accepts the risks involved.

14 Commencement of Competition Matches

- 14.1 Play must commence at the set time for the commencement of play if five (5) or more players are present. If five players are not present five minutes after commencement of the game, that team shall forfeit the match.
- 14.2 If neither team has five players present, the game shall be declared abandoned, and no points shall be awarded to either side. The scoresheet must be signed by the Umpire and Scorer and all details at the top filled in, including all player's signatures.
- 14.3 Any match shall finish in time to permit the following game to commence at the specified time, even if through starting late or an injury occurring, the match does not run the full time. There will be no injury time except in the finals.
- 14.4 A team set down to play a team who has withdrawn from the competition shall automatically receive a forfeit and does not require having five players of their team present but must provide umpires as set down.
- 14.5 The Captain of the team receiving the forfeit may sign the scoresheet to record the players' names.

15 Semi-finals, Finals and Grand Finals

- 15.1 Semi-finalists shall be the first four teams in each Division or Grade with the highest number of points. When two teams have an equal number of points,

the position shall be decided by counting goals scored for and against on a percentage basis of games played over the whole season.

- 15.2 The order of games is:
- a. Semi Finals - 1 plays 2; 3 plays 4;
 - b. Final - Loser of 1 v 2 plays winner of 3 v 4;
 - c. Grand Final - Winner of 1 v 2 plays winner of final.
- 15.3 When goals are even at full time in a Semi Final or Final, an additional five minutes each way shall be played. If the score is still even after this extra time play will continue until one team has a total score two goals higher than the opposing team.
- 15.4 When goals scored are even at full time in a Grand Final, an additional five minutes each way shall be played. If the score is still even, the game is declared a draw, and the teams are joint winners.
- 15.5 Before participation in Semi Finals, Finals or Grand Finals each team/club must be financial and each player shall have played and have had her name recorded on scoresheets or sheets of forfeited matches or won by forfeit, three competition matches, with that team except as provided in 15.6 and 17.4 below. Each player must have completed correctly details on the team/club's registration sheet.
- 15.6 Any club player, after having played three (3) matches within that club, may play up in the Final series, however, with the exception of injury or illness all registered team players must have first priority as finals participants before bringing players up.
- 15.7 Teams that are a single "club" teams in a competition that have suffered injury or illness to an extent that they cannot field a full team for finals may approach other clubs or single teams to borrow players for the finals if they do not have enough regular players available. For the intent of this rule a full team will consist of at least seven (7) players and up to two (2) reserves.
- 15.8 For a player to be eligible for consideration under rule 15.7 they must meet the following criteria:
- (a) Must be a current financial TNA registered player,
 - (b) Must have played at least three (3) games with their club in the current Saturday competition,
 - (c) Must come from a lower division or grade and be playing up for the requesting team.
 - (d) At the start of play, must comply with 15.6
 - (e) Requests to play players under this rule must be forwarded to the TNA VP Competition for approval at least 2 days prior to commencement of a final.

Note: Single teams will not be able to approach players outside the Saturday competition, e.g. a player registered with TNA who plays State League only or a player from another Association, for a player to be eligible for consideration they must meet any set criteria already in the Rules and Bylaws.

16 Umpires, Scorers and Timekeepers

- 16.1 No official match shall be played without two umpires and two scorers. The umpire shall take no part in the game. Scorers must stand together throughout the game. Any dispute brought before the Appeals Tribunal may not be considered unless both scorers are present. After the commencement of the game, there shall be no substitutes for either umpire unless approved by the Competition Convenor.
- 16.2 Each team is required to provide umpires as set out in the fixture. Failure to provide umpires may result in a maximum fine of \$40, to be paid within seven (7) days - the team will not be allowed to play until it is paid, except if the team on the same day that they failed to do their umpiring duty is set down to play at a time after that failure. In that case they will not be allowed to play the next week until the fine is paid in full. TNA Inc reserves the right to provide umpires and invoice teams or clubs accordingly. All invoices must be paid within seven (7) days.
- 16.3 Each and every member of Senior, Cadet and Intermediate teams shall be encouraged to sit for the TNA umpire's theory exam as they are conducted each year.
- 16.4 All teams involved in a forfeit shall still provide umpires as shown on fixtures for that day (see By-Law 14.4).
- 16.5 All persons who attain a National Umpires Badge Levels A, B or C through TNA Inc shall provide their services to assist TNA Inc with all umpiring responsibilities for the proceeding netball season consisting of twelve months.
- 16.6 Timekeepers are responsible for keeping time for games during the finals. Two timekeepers shall be supplied for the matches by the teams involved in the final. The main timekeeper is to time quarters and quarter and half-time breaks. The backup timekeeper times injury and blood rule time. The main timekeeper commences timing of play from the umpires whistle. If the umpire signals a break the main timekeeper stops the timer on the umpires whistle and restarts timing on the umpires whistle. If the stoppage is for an injury the backup timekeeper commences timing. The main timekeeper should leave the official area when there are 10 seconds left in the quarter and follow the closest umpire until time is up when they call to the umpire "Time Umpire". At quarter and half time breaks the timekeeper should advise the umpire when there are 30 seconds to the start of play and again at 10 seconds and when time is up by saying "Time Umpire".
- 16.7 Injury time and blood rule time is two minutes. The back up timekeeper commences timing on the umpires signal. When 30 seconds is left of the injury time the timekeeper advises the umpire, and again at 10 seconds, and at the completion of time.
- 16.8 Umpires shall comply with TNA policy in respect of uniform.

16.8.1 Competition rounds

- (1) The top must be white and may be a T-shirt, jumper, hoodie or jacket.
- (2) Any comfortable lower body apparel may be worn which may include playing uniform, black track pants, suitable shorts, leggings or skirts.
- (3) A TNA trainee umpire bib may be worn inside out.

16.8.2 Finals.

- a. A TNA Umpire shirt or plain, club-neutral white shirt.
- b. Any comfortable lower body apparel in white or black. This may include black track pants, suitable shorts, leggings or skirts.
- c. A white jumper/hoodie/jacket may be worn if the weather is cold

17 Scoresheets

- 17.1 The Executive has the power to call any team concerned with the falsifying of records or unregistered players before it and, if necessary, disqualify that team from the Association.
- 17.2 All players/ must have their names on the scoresheets prior to a match.
- 17.3 The captain of the winning team is responsible for returning the scoresheet.
- 17.4 All scoresheets must be signed by both captains, all players, umpires and scorers, and all details at the top filled in.
- 17.5 If a captain considers the scoresheet incorrect, she shall not sign it. The captain will fill in a notification of dispute form is available from the Convenor.
- 17.6 A team receiving a forfeit shall return the scoresheet as usual.
- 17.7 Any player playing a higher division shall indicate the name of the team in which she is registered on the scoresheet.

18 Points

- 18.1 Points shall be awarded in competition matches as follows:
 - a. Win 3 points
 - b. Draw 2 points
 - c. Win on forfeit 3 points

19 Adverse Weather

- 19.1 The Vice President Competition and appropriate convenors will be responsible for convening a committee to make competition decisions relating to adverse weather.
- 19.2 Unless an announcement of no play is made, all players shall attend their playing areas. If the game has progressed past half-time when adverse weather stops play, the game is to be counted and the half time score counts. If it rains before half-time, the game may be abandoned.
- 19.3 If the Committee decides that there will be no play, as far as Rule 19.2 is concerned, the game will be counted for players who required the abandoned game to qualify to play finals.
- 19.4 The nights/dates to be used for possible make up games are to be set by the adverse weather committee before the season commences and included in the TNA calendar.

20 Complaints

- 20.1 Refer to Sporting Behaviour and Discipline Policy and Procedures for full detail.
- 20.2 Clarification of umpires interpretation and/or rules should be sought from the umpire in the first instance at the next interval of the game. Only the captain of the team may approach an umpire during an interval for clarification. If this does not resolve the situation then a TNA Official should be called to the court to observe the game and try to resolve the problem. In the event the team still wishes to lodge a complaint, this should be done in accordance with 20.3.
- 20.3 Any formal match complaints or protest by a team or umpire must be notified to a TNA official by filling in a notification of dispute form. The protesting captain is not to sign the scoresheet. The matter will then be referred to a Match Review Officer.
- 20.4 The Match Review Officer is a person appointed by TNA to administer the process for dealing with a report.
- 20.5 The Match Review Sub-committee is a panel of officials from TNA formed to review reports and determine any action to be taken in respect of reported incidents at TNA.
- 20.6 Quorum for a Match Review Sub-committee hearing, if required, will be three members made up of any of the following:
- The Match Review Officer

 - c. Umpires Coordinator
 - d. Any member of the TNA Executive
 - e. A TNA Life Member
- 20.7 The Appeals Sub-committee will consider appeals and is a panel comprising a TNA Life Member and club officials representing clubs participating in the category and division in which the incident occurred. Club officials participating are not to be affiliated with the club of either the complainant or respondent.
- 20.8 Quorum for an Appeals Sub-committee, if required, will be three members of the panel described in 20.7.

SECTION D - Representative Teams

21 Selection

- 21.1 Selection of representative teams shall be done in accordance with the guidelines set out in the Representative Selection policy.
- 21.2 The TNA Inc. Executive is to review the Representative Selection policy for both Junior and Senior Representative Selections prior to the commencement of each representative season.
- 21.3 The Executive Committee may allow at its discretion, players not registered with TNA teams or clubs to represent TNA in Junior and Senior representative competitions.
- 21.4 Players not registered with a TNA club but who wish to represent TNA must register with TNA Inc and must pay the required registration fee to the TNA before they are eligible to play. The registration fee is to be set by the Executive Committee and will cover insurance and administration fees.
